SBIL and its partners are actively involved in training programs that provide valuable insights for small business owners to exploit the various available green finance options.

In this edition of the newsletter, you will read about the upcoming Women Empowerment for Development (WE4D) project. The two-year program is designed to support women-owned enterprises in key sectors such as sustainable agriculture and agro-processing, renewable energy and circular economy/waste management.

In a nutshell, by innovating and seizing business opportunities focusing on green sectors, value chains and the circular economy, your enterprise has a very good chance of attracting investors and new financing.

sing an incubation model, the Uganda Climate Innovation Fund (UCIF) is championing climate-smart entrepreneurship with SBIL acting as the capacity-building partner.

In Window 1, five pioneering innovators are actively working on groundbreaking solutions for post-harvest handling, fruit preservation, organic soil fertility and soil water management. Each of these pioneers has received their initial grant disbursement and is diligently progressing towards their agreed milestones.

Over the past quarter, UCIF (which is funded by the UK Government) has provided targeted support to ensure

these pioneers are equipped for success. From needs assessments and financial reporting training to tax clinics, Gender Equality and Social Inclusion (GESI) training, and Lean Startup Workshops, the incubation process has been designed to help them achieve problem-solution fit. Regular check-ins facilitate close mentorship and accountability, ensuring steady progress.

Meanwhile, due diligence for Window 2 pioneers has been completed and we eagerly await the final selection decision. Looking ahead, we are excited to announce that Window 3 will officially launch on April 21, 2025. Stay tuned for more updates as we continue to drive innovation for a climate-resilient Uganda.



Empowering Women **Entrepreneurs:**

NSSF Hi Innovator Women Accelerator





he Hi-Innovator Women Accelerator Window IV (WAW IV) Pre-Investment Boot Camp brought together 66 promising businesses at Mestil Hotel, Kampala, for an intensive four-day program. It was designed to equip these entrepreneurs with the knowledge and tools needed to compete for the \$20,000 each in funding.

These businesses had expressed interest in joining the accelerator program and after a rigorous quality assurance process, they were selected to participate in the boot camp. During the first phase of the selection process, the main focus was on strategic business growth, financial viability, market positioning and investment readiness.

By way of expert-led sessions, hands-on workshops and pitch practice, participants refined their business strategies, enhanced their commercial competencies and strengthened their financial management skills. Following the boot camp, the participants underwent a due diligence process, including physical site visits, after which 54 businesses were recommended to proceed to face the Investment Committee.

The program also provided a platform for networking, mentorship and peer learning, setting the stage for these entrepreneurs to confidently compete for funding and scale their businesses.

Stanbic Accelerator Program and Supplier Development Program - Coaching and Mentorship



ver the past year, 52 businesses have benefited from the Stanbic Accelerator Programme and the Supplier Development Program. These businesses participated in a comprehensive 3-month training program, which was further enriched by personalized coaching and mentorship.

The support included one-on-one sessions, site visits and virtual guidance. The coaching phase, launched in October 2024 with the assistance of three (3) Short-Term Technical Assistants (STTAs), will conclude at the end of March and has already provided invaluable support to 49 businesses.

During this phase, the business owners developed six-month growth plans tailored to their business diagnoses, and they have actively implemented the recommended

changes. Noteworthy progress has been observed in 34 of these businesses, particularly in areas such as strategy, sales and marketing, governance and business modelling.

These improvements demonstrate the substantial impact of coaching and mentorship, which have been instrumental in identifying and addressing key challenges, paving the way for sustainable growth and success.

The transformation of these businesses is a clear reflection of the effectiveness of the support provided and we eagerly anticipate their continued progress in the months ahead. This journey also underscores the power of perseverance. Despite facing a range of challenges, these entrepreneurs have exhibited remarkable resilience and determination.

They have embraced coaching, learned from setbacks, and kept moving forward. Their stories are a powerful reminder that success is not about avoiding failure but rather about confronting it, learning from it and using it as a stepping-stone to greater achievements.

The perseverance of these entrepreneurs serves as an inspiring example for others. Keep pushing forward, stay resilient and let your perseverance drive your entrepreneurial journey to new heights.

It is implemented by Deutsche Gesellschaft für Internationale Zusammenarbeit (GIZ) GmbH, in close collaboration with the Ministry of Gender, Labour and Social Development (MGLSD), which serves as the lead government partner.

WE4D is implementing a project titled 'Green Businesses and Jobs for the Green Transformation' in Kenya, Tanzania and Uganda in collaboration with Stanbic Business Incubator Limited (SBIL) in Uganda. This project aims to support the growth of 200 green/greening women-led micro and small enterprises in these 3 countries by providing business training, coaching and access to finance.

Stanbic Business Incubator Limited (SBIL) is in the early stages of mobilising and identifying qualified candidates for an exciting new program set to run over the next two years, until December 2027. This initiative is designed to support enterprises in key

sectors such as sustainable agriculture and agro-processing, renewable energy and circular economy/waste management.
